Definition of Noun:

Types of Nouns:

1. Common and Proper Nouns

2. Collective Nouns

Formation of Abstract Nouns:

• From adjectives: Kindness (from kind), honesty (from honest)

• From verbs: Obedience (from obey), growth (from grow)

• From common nouns: Childhood (from child), slave (from slave)

4. Countable and Uncountable Nouns

Countable Nouns: Names objects or people that can be counted and have plural forms.

Example: Books, pens, sisters

Uncountable Nouns: Denotes things that cannot be counted individually.

Example: Milk, oil, honesty
